



izv. prof. dr. sc. **Vladimira Vuletić**, dr. med., je rođena u Slavanskom Brodu. Završila je Medicinski fakultet u Zagrebu 1997, doktorirala 2011. Od 2016. godine je predstojnica Klinike za neurologiju KBC Rijeka, a od 2018. godine pročelnica Katedre za neurologiju Medicinskog fakulteta Sveučilišta u Rijeci. Zamjenica ravnatelja KBC-a Rijeka bila je 2021. godine, a potom vodi Ured za znanost KBC-a Rijeka. Članica je međunarodno priznatog tima za operativno liječenje ekstrapiramidnih bolesti dubokim moždanim stimulacijama od 2009.-te godine, a osnovala je i vodi Referentni centar Ministarstva zdravstva za prije proceduralnu pripremu i poslijeproceduralno liječenje i rehabilitaciju farmakorezistentnih bolesti pokreta invazivnim metodama, posebice dubinskom mozgovnom stimulacijom na Klinici za neurologiju KBC Rijeka.

Aktivno je sudjelovala ne samo na međunarodnim i nacionalnim skupovima, tečajevima, školama, kongresima s više od 200 pozvanih predavanja (pretežno izvan RH). Autorica je i koautorica mnogih znanstvenih i neznastvenih članaka i knjiga. Voditeljica je mnogih nacionalnih, europskih i međunarodnih znanstvenih projekata, organizatorica mnogih međunarodnih i nacionalnih skupova iz kojih izdvajamo osam Riječkih foruma neurodegenerativnih bolesti i četiri regionalna skupa dubinske mozgovne stimulacije te tečaja Movement Disorders Society-ja o naprednoj dubinskoj mozgovnoj stimulaciji.

Od 2013. godine stječe zvanje primariususa. Glavna je mentorica mnogim mladim liječnicima na specijalizaciji, na diplomskim radovima i doktorskim disertacijama. Uz članstva u mnogim društvima, počasna je članica Europske akademije za neurologiju (FEAN), Američke neurološke akademije (FAAN) Royal Medicine society te Svjetskog društva za Parkinsonovu bolest i povezane bolesti (IAPRD). Sudionica je mnogih znanstvenih panela te članica odbora i skupština mnogih neuroloških društava poput Europske neurološke akademije i Hrvatskog neurološkog društva. Od 2019. godine ima zvanje i subspecijalistice za neurodegenerativne bolesti. U Akademiji medicinskih znanosti je od 2024.



Professor **Vladimira Vuletić**, M.D, Ph.D., primaria, FEAN, FAAN

Vladimira Vuletic was born in Slavonski Brod and graduated at the Medical School University of Zagreb. She received her PhD degree. She is board certified specialist in neurology, subspecialist of neurodegenerative diseases and movement disorders. From 2016 she is acting as Head of Clinical Department of Neurology University Hospital Rijeka and from 2018 as a Head of Neurology Department of Medical faculty University of Rijeka. One year she was acting as a Deputy Director of University Hospital Rijeka and after that period as the Head of Research and Development Department in UHC Rijeka. She founded and leads the Reference Center of the Ministry of Health for pre-procedural preparation and post-procedural treatment and rehabilitation of pharmacoresistant movement disorders using invasive methods, especially deep brain stimulation (DBS) at the Clinic for Neurology UHC Rijeka. She actively participated in international and national meetings, courses, schools, congresses with more than 200 invited lectures (mostly outside of Croatia). She is the author and co-author of many scientific and non-scientific articles and books. She is a manager of many national, European and international scientific projects, the organizer of many international and national meetings, like 8 Rijeka Forums on Neurodegenerative diseases and 4 Regional DBS meetings.

Since 2013, she has been receiving the title of primaria. She is the main mentor for many young doctors on their specialization, graduate theses and doctoral dissertations. In addition to memberships in many societies, she is an honorary member (fellow) of the European Academy of Neurology (FEAN), the American Academy of Neurology (FAAN), the Royal Medicine Society and the World Society for Parkinson's Disease and Related Diseases (IAPRD). She is a participant in many scientific panels and a member of the boards and assemblies of many neurological societies, such as the European Neurological Academy and the Croatian Neurological Society. She has been at the Academy of Medical Sciences since 2024.
