



Marjan Radej je rođen godine 1939. u Splitu. Školovao se u Zagrebu, gdje je diplomirao na Medicinskom fakultetu. Radio je u bolnici "Sv. Duh" u Zagrebu. Završio je specijalizaciju iz opće kirurgije, a zatim i iz urologije. Doktorat znanosti obranio je godine 1977. na Medicinskom fakultetu u Zagrebu, gdje je poslije izabran za znanstvenog savjetnika i izvanrednog sveučilišnog profesora iz područja urologije. Predavao je pretežno na poslijediplomskoj nastavi iz područja urokinamike, ultrazvuka u urologiji i ginekološke urologije. Četrnaest godina (od 1982. do 1996.) bio je predstojnik Zavoda za urologiju bolnice "Sv. Duh".

Objavio je preko stotinu znanstvenih i stručnih radova u svjetskoj i domaćoj literaturi, vlastitu knjigu „Urokinamika“, a 2004. g. izdao knjigu 'Urološki dijagnostički algoritmi' u izdanju Medicinske naklade u Zagrebu. Priložio je i brojne svoje tekstove skupnim medicinskim edicijama. Aktivno je s 23 svoja nastupa sudjelovao svojim radovima na svjetskim i europskim kongresima u Europi i u Sjevernoj Americi. Kao mentor je vodio sedam uspješnih obrana znanstvenih doktorata i magisterija svojih kolega iz područja urologije.

Tijekom rata 1990-95 sudjelovao je kao šef Urološkog odjela bolnice „Sv. Duh“ u kirurškom zbrinjavanju ranjenika, a posebno u liječenju i rehabilitaciji paraplegičnih bolesnika u suradnji s Rehabilitacijskim centrom u Varaždinskim Toplicama.

Bio je primljen i za aktivnoga člana više domaćih i međunarodnih liječničkih i znanstvenih udruženja (Hrvatsko urološko društvo, Svjetsko udruženje urologa, Europska urološka asocijacija i Akademija znanosti u New Yorku, Akademija medicinskih znanosti Hrvatske). Tijekom 1972. g radio je više mjeseci kao kirurg na edukaciji transplantacije bubrega u bolnicama u Aarhusu (Danska) i Geteborgu u bolnici Herlev (Švedska) u okviru Scandiatransplanta.

Osim znanstveno-nastavne aktivnosti, radio je, a i danas radi, u klinčkoj medicini, osobito u području urološke onkologije, bolesti inkontinencije i rekonstruktivne urologije.

Od 2004 godine je u mirovini.

Posljednjih je godina zaokupljen problemima organizacije zdravstvene sužbe i proučavanjem algoritamskih postupaka u kliničkoj medicini, te zdravstvenim prosvjećivanjem seniora u Pučkom otvorenom učilištu u Zagrebu te 2014. godine na Goethe sveučilištu u Frankfurtu na Majni. Tamo je predavao o preventivnoj medicini i problemima načina edukacije starije populacije da prihvati znanstvena načela u promjeni štetnih životnih navika koje skraćuju životni vijek.

Na internetu je vodio više medicinskih portala i surađivao u online povezivanju starijih ljudi s okolinom.

2015. godine je izabran za „Začasnog člana“ Zbora liječnika Hrvatske za „dugogodišnje usavršavanje medicinske znanosti i struka, unapređenje zdravlja naroda te za djelatnosti u radu Zbora“

Bavio se je i s prevođenjem popularnih knjiga iz područja genetike i biologije (G. Miller: „Razum i razmnožavanje“; B. Sykes: „Adamovo prokletstvo“ u izdanju Algoritma iz Zagreba).

Dr. sc. Marjan Radej živi u Zagrebu sa svojom suprugom Veronikom, također liječnicom, ima dvoje djece, troje unučadi i praunuku.



Marjan Radej was born in 1939 in Split. He was educated in Zagreb, where he graduated from the Faculty of Medicine. He worked at the "Sv. Duh" Hospital in Zagreb. He completed his specialization in general surgery and then in urology. He defended his doctorate in 1977 at the Faculty of Medicine in Zagreb, where he was later elected as a scientific advisor and associate professor in the field of urology. He lectured mainly at postgraduate courses in the fields of urodynamics, ultrasound in urology and gynecological urology. For fourteen years (from 1982 to 1996) he was the head of the Department of Urology at the "Sv. Duh" Hospital.

He has published over a hundred scientific and professional papers in international and domestic literature, his own book "Urodynamics", and in 2004 he published the book "Urological diagnostic algorithms" published by Medicinska naklada in Zagreb. He has also contributed numerous of his texts to joint medical editions. He actively participated with 23 of his presentations with his papers at world and European congresses in Europe and North America. As a mentor, he led seven successful defenses of scientific doctorates and master's degrees of his colleagues in the field of urology.

During the war of 1990-95, he participated as the head of the Urology Department of the "Sv. Duh" Hospital in the surgical care of the wounded, and especially in the treatment and rehabilitation of paraplegic patients in cooperation with the Rehabilitation Center in Varaždinske Toplice.

He was also accepted as an active member of several domestic and international medical and scientific associations (Croatian Urological Society, World Association of Urologists, European Urological Association and Academy of Sciences in New York, Croatian Academy of Medical Sciences). During 1972, he worked for several months as a surgeon on kidney transplantation education in hospitals in Aarhus (Denmark) and Gothenburg at Herlev Hospital (Sweden) within the framework of Scandia-transplant.

In addition to his scientific and teaching activities, he worked, and still works, in clinical medicine, especially in the fields of urological oncology, incontinence diseases and reconstructive urology. He has been retired since 2004.

In recent years, he has been preoccupied with the problems of organizing the health service and studying algorithmic procedures in clinical medicine, as well as health education of seniors at the Open University in Zagreb and in 2014 at the Goethe University in Frankfurt am Main. There, he lectured on preventive medicine and the problems of educating the elderly population to accept scientific principles in changing harmful lifestyle habits that shorten life expectancy.

He ran several medical portals on the Internet and collaborated in online connecting older people with their environment.

In 2015, he was elected an "Honorary Member" of the Croatian Medical Association for "many years of improving medical science and the profession, improving the health of the people, and for his activities in the work of the Association."

He has also translated popular books in the field of genetics and biology (G. Miller: "The mating mind", B. Sykes: "Adam's Curse" published by Algoritm from Zagreb).

Dr. Marjan Radej lives in Zagreb with his wife Veronika, also a doctor, and has two children, three grandchildren, and a great-granddaughter.
