



Fadila Pavičić, dr. med., dr. sc., pulmolog, primarijus, redoviti profesor u trajnom zvanju Medicinskog fakulteta Sveučilišta u Zagrebu

Rođena je 1941. godine. Osnovnu školu i gimnaziju završila je u Dubrovniku. Diplomirala je na Medicinskom fakultetu Sveučilišta u Zagrebu 1964. godine. U Kliničkoj bolnici za plućne bolesti "Jordanovac" radila je od 1967. do 2011. godine kao odjelni liječnik, voditeljica Kliničkog laboratorija za funkcionalnu dijagnostiku pluća te predstojnica Klinike za pulmologiju. U laboratorij uvodi najnovije pretrage za ispitivanje plućne funkcije, koji je 2005. godine pod njenim vodstvom dobio Europski certifikat izvrsnosti. Specijalistički ispit iz ftizilogije položila je 1969. godine, a potom užu specijalizaciju iz pulmologije. Doktorsku disertaciju „Neposredni utjecaj zračenja gama zrakama na respiratornu funkciju bolesnika s karcinomom bronha“ obranila je na Medicinskom fakultetu Sveučilišta u Zagrebu 1976. godine. Naziv primarijusa stekla je 1979. godine. Na Medicinskom fakultetu Sveučilišta u Zagrebu, na Katedri za internu medicinu, izabrana je u znanstveno-nastavno zvanje docenta 1981. godine, izvanrednog profesora 1984., redovitog profesora 1987. te redovitog profesora u trajnom zvanju 1998. godine. Na Medicinskom fakultetu Sveučilišta u Zagrebu na Katedri za internu medicinu u kumulativnom je radnom odnosu od 1984. do 2011. godine. Od 1. listopada 2002. do prvog 1. rujna 2010. godine predstojnica je Klinike za pulmologiju Kliničke bolnice za plućne bolesti "Jordanovac" te je ujedno voditeljica dodiplomske nastave iz pulmologije.

Objavila je 189 znanstvenih i stručnih radova u domaćim i inozemnim časopisima; autorica je 78 poglavlja u knjigama (nastavni tekstovi, udžbenici Interne medicine i ostale medicinske knjige). Mentorica je 12 doktorskih disertacija, 11 magistarskih radova i 11 diplomskih radova. Sudjelovala je kao glavna istraživačica ili suradnica u brojnim domaćim i inozemnim projektima. Bila je voditeljica poslijediplomskog studija iz pulmologije te predsjednica Izvršnog odbora za provedbu smjernica GOLD-a (Global Initiative for Obstructive Lung Diseases) u Hrvatskoj 2001. Članica je mnogobrojnih udruženja u Hrvatskoj (Hrvatsko pulmološko društvo, Hrvatsko torakalno društvo) i u inozemstvu (European Respiratory Society, Clinical Physiology Scientific Assembly of the European Respiratory Society i American Thoracic Society). Redovita je članica Hrvatske akademije medicinskih znanosti od 1994. godine. Za svoj rad dobila je brojne nagrade i priznanja: Zahvalnicu za osobni doprinos i uspješno obavljanje povjerenih funkcija u radu Savjeta Medicinskog fakulteta u Zagrebu (1984.), Priznanje za dugogodišnji osobni doprinos i zalaganje u Pulmološkoj djelatnosti Hrvatskog pulmološkog društva HLZ-a (1995.) te Povelju za osobiti doprinos Zboru, medicinskoj znanosti i zdravstvu u Republici Hrvatskoj HLZ-a (1997.).



Fadila Pavičić, MD, PhD, pulmonologist, primarius, full professor with permanent tenure at the University of Zagreb School of Medicine.

She was born in 1941. She completed primary school and high school in Dubrovnik. She graduated from the University of Zagreb School of Medicine in 1964. From 1967 to 2011 she worked at the Clinical Hospital for Pulmonary Diseases "Jordanovac" as a ward physician, head of the Clinical Laboratory for Functional Lung Diagnostic, and later as head of the Department of Pulmonology. She introduced the most advanced lung function tests to the laboratory, which, under her leadership received the European Certificate of Excellence in 2005. She passed her specialist examination in phthysiology in 1969, followed by a subspecialisation in pulmonology. She defended her doctoral dissertation "Direct effect of gamma ray irradiation on the respiratory function of patients with bronchial carcinoma" at the University of Zagreb School of Medicine in 1976. She obtained the professional title primarius in 1979. At the University of Zagreb School of Medicine, Department of Internal Medicine, she was elected to academic ranks as Assistant Professor in 1981, Associate Professor in 1984, Full Professor in 1987, and Full Professor with tenure in 1998. She worked at the School of Medicine, University of Zagreb, Department of Internal Medicine, in a cumulative employment relationship from 1984 to 2011. From October 1, 2002, to September 1, 2010, she served as Head of the Pulmonology Clinic of the Clinical Hospital for Pulmonary Diseases "Jordanovac" and concurrently as Head of the Undergraduate Program in Pulmonology.

She has published 189 scientific and professional papers in national and international journals and is the author of 78 chapters in books including teaching texts, textbooks of Internal Medicine and other medical works. She has supervised of 12 doctoral dissertations, 11 master's theses and 11 undergraduate theses. She participated as a principal investigator or collaborator in numerous national and international projects. She was also the head of the postgraduate study in pulmonology and the president of the Executive Committee for the implementation of the GOLD (Global Initiative for Obstructive Lung Diseases) guidelines in Croatia in 2001. She is a member of numerous professional associations in Croatia (Croatian Respiratory Society, Croatian Thoracic Society) and abroad (European Respiratory Society, Clinical Physiology Scientific Assembly of the European Respiratory Society, and American Thoracic Society). She has been a full member of the Croatian Academy of Medical Sciences since 1994. For her professional achievements, she received numerous awards and honours, including the Certificate of Appreciation for her personal contribution within the Council of the University of Zagreb School of Medicine (1984); The Recognition for long-term contribution and dedication to the field of pulmonology awarded by the Croatian Respiratory Society of the Croatian Medical Association (1995); and the Charter for distinguished Contribution to the Association, Medical Science, and Healthcare in the Republic of Croatia (1997).
