



Bulić Krešimir, izv. prof. dr. sc.

Rođen u Splitu 1969. godine, osnovnu školu je pohađao u Zagrebu, a srednju školu završio u Bostonu u SAD-u. Diplomirao je na Medicinskom fakultetu u Zagrebu 1993. godine među najboljih 5% studenata. Nakon pripravničkog staža u KBC Zagreb stručni ispit je položio 1994. godine. Od 1995. do 1998. godine radi kao djelatni časnik Hrvatske vojske.

Specijalistički ispit iz opće kirurgije je položio u KBC Zagreb 2003. godine, a iste godine je obranio magisterij znanosti na Medicinskom fakultetu u Zagrebu pod naslovom "Ispitivanje promjena vertebrobazilarne cirkulacije dopler – ultrazvukom nakon trzajne ozljede vratne kralješnice". Plastičnu, estetsku i rekonstrukcijsku kirurgiju subspecijalizira u KBC Zagreb, a dvije godine subspecijalizacije provodi u Queen Victoria Hospital u Velikoj Britaniji. Subspecijalistički ispit je položio 2008. godine i od tada radi u Zavodu za plastičnu kirurgiju i kirurgiju dojke KBC Zagreb te kao asistent na Medicinskom fakultetu u Zagrebu.

Doktorat znanosti pod naslovom "Povezanost razine autokrinog hormona rasta, E-kadherina i katenina u bolesnika s rakom dojke" je obranio na Prirodoslovno-matematičkom fakultetu u Zagrebu 2010. godine, 2015. godine postaje docent, a 2021. godine izvanredni profesor na Medicinskom fakultetu u Zagrebu. 2020. godine stječe titulu znanstvenog savjetnika.

Tijekom svoje stručne karijere je sudjelovao u radu brojnih domaćih i međunarodnih stručnih skupova kao predavač i organizator te u realizaciji više znanstvenih projekata. Objavio je preko 70 stručnih i znanstvenih radova koji su citirani preko 650 puta u stručnoj literaturi te mentorirao izradu brojnih diplomskih i doktorskih radova. Član je brojnih stručnih društava, a trenutno obnaša dužnost dopredsjednika Hrvatskog društva za plastičnu estetsku i rekonstrukcijsku kirurgiju.

Za svoj rad dobio je više priznanja, između ostalih Povelju Hrvatskog liječničkog zbora, Nagradu za posebno postignuće u medicinskoj struci i znanosti Medicinskog fakulteta te Nagradu grada Zagreba, a široj javnosti postaje poznat kao član tima koji je izveo prvo uspješno razdvajanje sijamskih blizanaca u Hrvatskoj 2019. godine.

Područja posebnog stručnog interesa dr. Bulića su kirurgija šake i prirođenih anomalija, te rekonstrukcijska kirurgija.

Born in Split in 1969, he attended primary school in Zagreb and completed high school in Boston, USA. He graduated from the School of Medicine in Zagreb in 1993, among the top 5% of students. After an internship at KBC Zagreb, he passed the license exam in 1994. From 1995 to 1998, he worked as an active officer in the Croatian Army.

He passed the specialist exam in general surgery at KBC Zagreb in 2003, and in the same year he defended his Master of Science degree at the Faculty of Medicine in Zagreb with the title "Examination of changes in vertebrobasilar circulation by Doppler ultrasound after whiplash injury to the cervical spine". He subspecialised in plastic, aesthetic and reconstructive surgery at KBC Zagreb, having spent two years of subspecialization at Queen Victoria Hospital in Great Britain. He passed the subspecialty exam in 2008 and has been working at the Department of Plastic Surgery and Breast Surgery at the University Hospital Center Zagreb and as an assistant at the Faculty of Medicine in Zagreb since then.

He defended his PhD thesis entitled "The relationship between autocrine growth hormone levels, E-cadherin and catenin in patients with breast cancer" at the Faculty of Science in Zagreb in 2010, in 2015 he became an assistant professor, and in 2021 an associate professor at the School of Medicine in Zagreb. In 2020 he acquired the title of scientific advisor.

During his professional career, he participated in numerous domestic and international professional conferences as a lecturer and organizer and in the implementation of several scientific projects. He has published over 70 professional and scientific papers that have been cited over 650 times in professional literature, and has mentored the preparation of numerous graduate and doctoral theses. He is a member of numerous professional societies, and currently serves as vice president of the Croatian Society for Plastic, Aesthetic and Reconstructive Surgery.

He has received several awards for his work, including the Charter of the Croatian Medical Association, the Award for Special Achievement in the Medical Profession and Science of the School of Medicine, and the Award of the City of Zagreb, and is known to the wider public as a member of the team that performed the first successful separation of siamese twins in Croatia in 2019.

Dr. Bulić's areas of special professional interest are hand surgery and congenital anomalies, and reconstructive surgery.
